We care more about others feeling comfortable than being right about social or linguistic faux pas. This focus on human-centered values creates psychologically safe environments where diversity can flourish and real community ties can be built.

But in situations where tradition is more desirable than individuality, etiquette can be a “double-edged sword”. Some customs, like gendered dress codes or formal marriage norms, can feel like being stuck in the past. They can suffocate authenticity and erect walls for people who don’t fit a traditional mold. Used as a tool for social compliance or as a way of judging others, etiquette can become a vehicle of exclusion and class prejudice rather than a bridge of connection. This type of superficial engagement can result in social interaction out of obligation, rather than a genuine desire to connect with others.

Etiquette must remain a positive force, and must be treated as a living code, changing to meet the needs of a varied society. It’s about challenging the norm of history and putting values first, such as being kind and being yourself, rather than rigidly following history. When it is flexible and sensitive to the needs of specific groups (different cultural practices, for example), etiquette ceases to be a set of rules and becomes a means of freedom. The end goal is to make social rules work for us to create a world where we can all thrive without the invisible chains of outdated expectations.

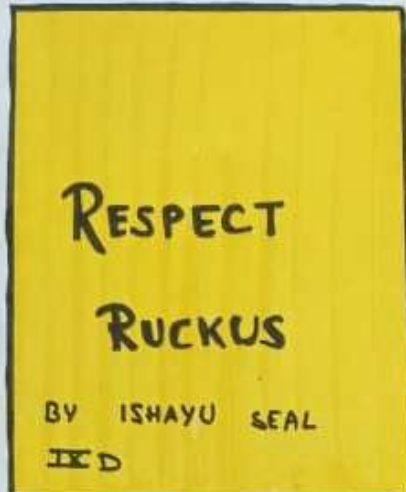
Respect is not always loud.
